INFANT BAPTISMS

For children **under 8 years of age**, the sacrament is celebrated the **FIRST** Sunday of the month at 2:00 p.m. Parents must present the birth certificate of the child. Both parents and godparents are expected to attend one catechetical session in advance, on the Wednesday before the baptism, at 7:00 pm.

SACRAMENTS OF CHRISTIAN INITIATION

Before being fully initiated into the sacramental life of the Church, **children over the age of 7** will need catechetical preparation through the RCIA process. **Teenagers** and **adults** will participate in **separate** RCIA processes.

CONFIRMATION and COMMUNION

For those already baptized, preparation for these Sacraments will take place according to the person's age and knowledge of the Catholic Faith. For further information contact the Office of Faith Formation Program.

MARRIAGES

Couples should contact the parish office at least **six months in advance** to make the proper arrangements for the Sacrament of Matrimony.

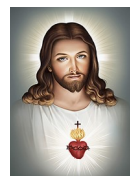

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK:

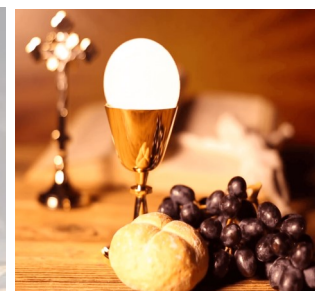
Dear Parishioners

"There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish;..." I am sure that boy that is spoken of in the gospel this Sunday had no idea that Jesus would use what he had to feed over five thousand people. The point of the National Eucharistic Congress that ended in Indiana last Sunday was to help the church in the United States revive its awareness of the great gift that God gives to us in the Sacrament of the Eucharist. God wants to feed the multitudes of souls with his presence in the Eucharist.

Cardinal Luis Tagle, the Papal Envoy to the United States, gave the homily at the closing Mass for the National Eucharistic Congress. He said, "The Eucharist is a privileged moment to experience Jesus' mission as a gift of himself." He went on to point out that God made us all to be like his Son who was sent to be given. God made us all as gifted people who are strengthened by the Eucharist to be evangelizers and people with the mission to give ourselves like Christ so that the world may come closer to Christ. The Cardinal asked if we in our parishes and personal lives contribute to people departing from Christ or coming closer to Christ.

This Congress completed the second year of the Bishops' three-year plan of Revival. We are now in the third year which began last Sunday, July 21, 2024 and will go to Pentecost 2025. The third year is the year of mission in which we, as Catholics, are called to share the gift of our Eucharistic Lord with others with a missionary spirit guided by the Holy Spirit. Let pray for the enlightenment and courage from the Holy Spirit to be a Eucharistic people drawing God's people to Jesus, our Redeemer, by the way we live out our faith in the different situations of our lives. Jesus wants to take the five barley loaves and two fish in our basket and feed the multitude by his power and our cooperation. Our Lady of Fatima, pray for us.

DESDE EL ESCRITORIO DEL PASTOR:

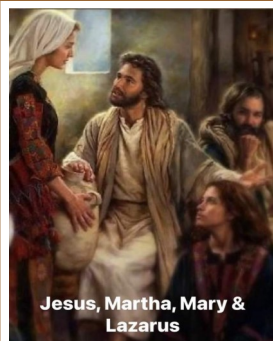
Queridos Feligreses

El objetivo del Congreso Eucarístico Nacional que terminó en Indiana el domingo pasado fue ayudar a la Iglesia en los Estados Unidos a reavivar su conciencia del gran regalo que Dios nos da en el Sacramento de la Eucaristía. Dios quiere alimentar a las multitudes de almas con su presencia en la Eucaristía.

El Cardenal Luis Tagle, enviado papal a los Estados Unidos, pronunció la homilía en la misa de clausura del Congreso Eucarístico Nacional. Dijo: "La Eucaristía es un momento privilegiado para experimentar la misión de Jesús como un don de sí mismo". Continuó señalando que Dios nos hizo a todos para ser como su Hijo, quien fue enviado para ser dado. Dios nos hizo a todos como personas dotadas que son fortalecidas por la Eucaristía para ser evangelizadores y personas con la misión de entregarse como Cristo para que el mundo se acerque a Cristo. El Cardenal preguntó si nosotros, en nuestras parroquias y en nuestras vidas personales, contribuimos a que las personas se alejen de Cristo o se acerquen a Cristo.

Este Congreso completó el segundo año del plan trienal de avivamiento de los Obispos. Ahora estamos en el tercer año que comenzó el pasado domingo 21 de Julio de 2024 e irá a Pentecostés de 2025. El tercer año es el año de la misión en el que nosotros, como católicos, estamos llamados a compartir el don de nuestro Señor Eucarístico con los demás con un espíritu misionero guiado por el Espíritu Santo. 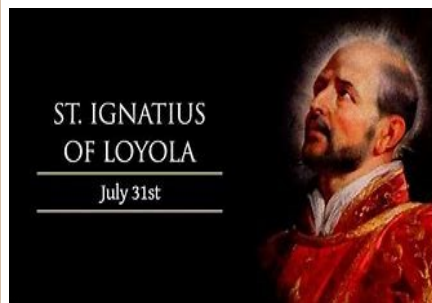

Jesus, Martha, Mary & Lazarus

Saints Martha, Mary, and Lazarus - Feast Day July 29

Were siblings who lived in Bethany, a village near Jerusalem. They were close friends of Jesus. He often visited their home. Each sibling had a special relationship with Jesus. Martha is known for her hospitality. She welcomed Jesus into her home and served Him with care. She sometimes worried too much about the details. But Jesus gently reminded her to focus on what truly mattered. Mary, Martha's sister, showed her love for Jesus in a different way. She sat at His feet and listened to His teachings. She also anointed Jesus' feet with expensive perfume. This act showed her deep love and respect for Him. Lazarus, their brother, was also loved by Jesus. When Lazarus fell ill and died, Jesus performed a great miracle. He raised Lazarus from the dead. This event showed Jesus' power over life and death.



ST. IGNATIUS
OF LOYOLA
July 31st

Saint Ignatius of Loyola - Feast Day July 31

Was born in 1491 in Spain. He came from a noble family and grew up in a castle. As a young man, he dreamed of being a soldier and serving his king. He was brave and loved adventure. In 1521, Ignatius was injured in a battle. His leg was badly hurt, and he had to stay in bed for many months. During this time, he read books about Jesus and the saints. These stories made him think about his life and his faith. He decided to follow Jesus and leave his old life behind. He went on a pilgrimage to a shrine in Spain. He prayed a lot and spent time alone with God. He also wrote a book called the Spiritual Exercises. This book helps people grow closer to God through prayer and reflection. Many people still use this book today. Later, Ignatius started a group called the Society of Jesus, also known as the Jesuits. They focused on education, missionary work, and helping the poor. He and the Jesuits worked hard to spread the message of Jesus. They made a big impact on the Church and the world. Ignatius died in 1556, but his legacy continues through the

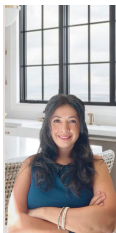
